

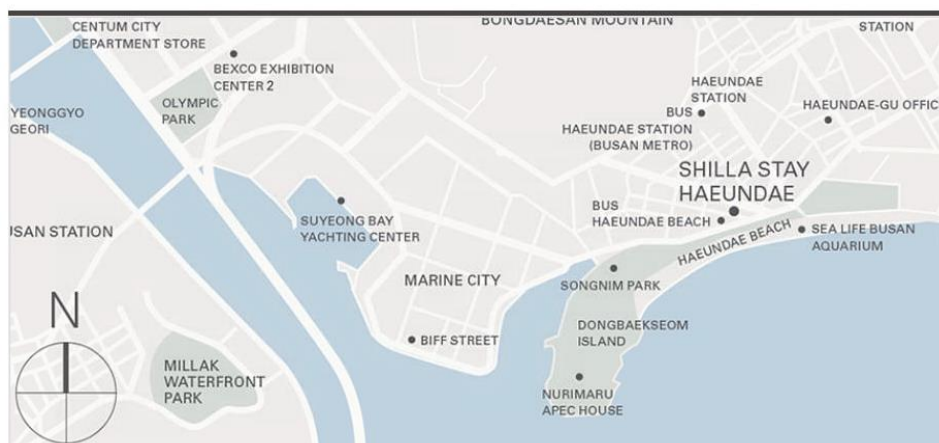

Venue

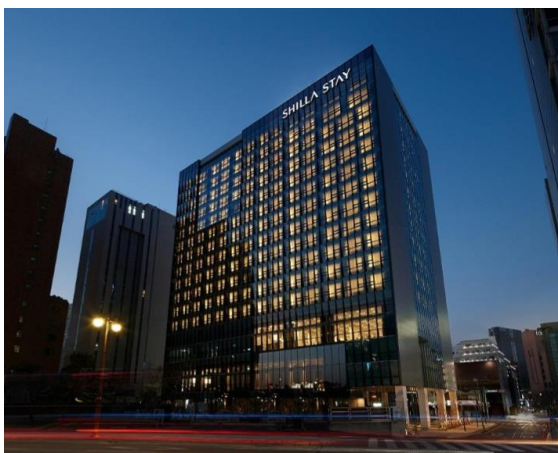

Transportation

To and From Gimhae International Airport

The Gimhae International Airport is located at Daejeo 2-dong, Gangseo-gu, Busan.

While there are several transportation options to travel from the Gimhae Airport to Shilla Stay Haeundae, we recommend considering:

- 1. Limousine Bus** (Cost : Adult KRW7,000)
Boarding location : Platform No.2 on the 1st floor of Domestic and International Flights
Disembarking location : Haeundae Beach Station
Boarding time : 06:50~22:00(every 30 minutes)
Travel time : Approx. 1 hour
- 2. Taxi**
Board in front of the bus stop on the 1st floor
General 30,000KRW, Black Cab 45,000KRW or less (Approx. 60 mins)

Weather

Korea has four seasons, with a wet monsoon/summer season in the middle of the year, and a cold winter from November to February. Spring is from March to May, and the April remains chilly in the mornings and evening. The temperature in April in Busan is min. 10 °C to max. 18° C. Tourist Information

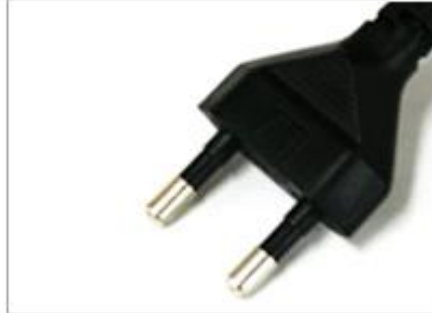

Electrical Power

The standard voltage in Korea is 220 volts. The outlet has two round holes and is the same type used in France, Germany, Austria, Greece, Turkey, and many other countries. If you do not have a multi-voltage travel adapter, you can borrow one from your hotel's front desk.



Currency

The won or the Korean Won is the currency of South Korea. A single won is divided into 100 jeon, the monetary subunit. The jeon is no longer used for everyday transactions, and appears only in foreign exchange rates.
